



Advanced Gang Investigation

(40 Hours)

This course conducts an advanced examination of street gang investigations. Designed for officers who already possess basic street gang knowledge, this program offers you an in-depth study of national gang structures, intelligence gathering, advanced graffiti analysis, interviewing tactics and officer survival skills.

You will learn how gangs recruit new members and how to utilize the various national programs available that are designed to prevent gang membership. You will see what to look for in a shooting or other assault that may indicate if it was drug-related, an initiation, a turf war or other gang activity. More importantly, you will learn the various techniques used by gangs in their attacks on police officers along with valuable tactics you can use to increase your safety.

Topics include:

- Gang violence investigations
- Recruitment of gang members
- Current trends in social and economic factors conducive to gang affiliation
- Survival tactics for gang encounters
- Advanced graffiti analysis

- Advanced gang intelligence gathering
- Conducting advanced gang interviews
- Gang prevention strategies
- Organizing and staffing gang units

Notes: You are strongly encouraged to bring examples of graffiti, videos, videotaped interviews and/or reports from your jurisdiction for classroom analysis and a personal thumb drive media for additional networking purposes.

Prerequisite: Because of the advanced subject matter, completion of IPTM's *Street Gangs Identification and Investigation* course is recommended.

Audience: Patrol officers, newly assigned and veteran detectives, supervisors, military investigative personnel, crime analysis personnel, school officials, gang unit, homicide, narcotics, parole and probation, prosecutors and juvenile justice personnel, school security, counselors, teachers and school resource officers
